TAIZÉ AND TENEBRAE

Taizé prayer songs were developed by an ecumenical community of monks in rural Taizé, France. The simple phrases, repeated over and over, create a meditative environment. This practice moves prayer from the head to the heart. Tonight, one Taizé song will be interspersed between the readings.

A Service of Tenebrae, or "Shadows", is an extended meditation on the passion (suffering) of Christ. Fourteen candles, along with a central Christ candle, are lighted as the service begins. A candle is extinguished at the conclusion of each reading.

Like the tomb of Jesus, the service ends in darkness and silence.
